

THE 12 GODS

1. Goddess Athena

This goddess was a supreme entity worshipped by most ancient Greeks and then Romans but she is also loved by many people of today's world. Her Roman name was Minerva. Athena was associated with warcraft and she could find the road of victory in any battle/war. She was also related to heroism, counsel, weaving and pottery. Athena's relation to the olive tree and olive oil is well known by most people of the Western civilization. Her parents was King Zeus and Titanis Metis but many historians claim that she had no mother but only a father (Zeus). Athena was a virgin goddess and she had no children. She was an entity who owned deep wisdom and she was associated with the Owl and the Crow, two powerful birds she created. Athena appeared with a battle helmet and a lethal spear. She was the protector of the city of Athens.

2. Goddess Hera

This supreme Goddess was the wife of Zeus. Her roman name is Juno. Hera was the queen of heaven. She ruled over all women on planet Earth. Hera's responsibility was to protect the concept of marriage and impregnation. Her parents were the titan Kronos and the titanis Rhea. She gave birth to a multitude of entities like the God of war, Ares but also to Hephaistos and Hebe. Hera was associated with many animals especially birds like the peacock, the crane, the hawk but also with the cuckoo and the lion. As with all the Olympians, Hera created many plants on Earth like the lotus and the chaste tree (and also the Pomegranate).

3. Goddess Demetra

This powerful Goddess was named Ceres by the Romans. She was the ruler of agriculture and primarily the Goddess of grain and bread. She was also associated with afterlife. Her parents were the titan Kronos and the titanis Rhea. Demetra was not married but she gave birth to many other entities like Persephone and Ploutos. Demetra was related to many living organisms on planet Earth like most serpents, the swine and the gecko. Other plants (apart from wheat) Demetra was associated with were the barley, the poppy and the mint.

4. God Ares

This god is one of the most powerful entities of ancient times. The Romans called him Mars and he was the god of war and battle. Ares was associated with manliness. His parents were King Zeus and Queen Hera. He was the spouse of goddess Aphrodite. Together they gave birth to many powerful entities like Deimos (Death) and Phobos (Fear). Aphrodite, who was the goddess of love and sex, used to make Ares very jealous by having sexual relationships with other entities like with god Hephaistos. Ares was related to many animals (especially serpents) like the Vulture, the Eagle Owl and the Woodpecker. It is said the he created the plant Manna Ash. Ares appeared in the same way as goddess Athena (wearing a war helmet and carrying a spear).

5. God Zeus

This God was the King of all the Greek Gods. All decisions about planet Earth had to go through this entity. The Roman name for Zeus is Jupiter or Jove. As mentioned, Zeus was the King of heaven, the God of all weather conditions and phenomena, especially lightning bolts but he also ruled over fate in general and he had companions to all kingdoms on the planet. Zeus wasn't the oldest God though. His father was the titan Kronos (Saturn) and the titanis Rhea. Zeus was married to a powerful and truly beautiful Goddess. Her name was Hera. They had many children of which the most notable are some other Olympians Gods (Athena, Apollon, Artemis, Ares, Aphrodite, Hermes, Dionysos) but also the hero Herakles (Hercules). Zeus was associated with many animals but above all the golden eagle and the wolf. He created many plants and trees like the oak tree and the celery.

6. God Hermes

Hermes was another very important god of the Greek Pantheon. The Romans called him Mercury. He was associated with many things (more things than any other god). For example he was responsible for trade, travel and communications three important aspects of life and civilization. Moreover Hermes was related to the human and animal tongue and all languages. He was the herald of the gods and he could bring good luck to his followers. Greeks believed that Hermes was guiding the dead into their journey in the afterlife. His parents were King Zeus and the Nympe Maia (Taurus constellation). Hermes did not like marriage very much and as a result he had no spouse. But he gave birth to many important entities like Pan. Animals associated with Hermes were the Tortoise, the Sheep, the Hawk and the Cattle. Plants related to him were the Crocus and the Strawberry. He used to appear with his herald rod.

7. Goddess Artemis

Artemis was the goddess of the Moon. She was a famous entity of the ancient world who could run very fast. In the Roman Pantheon, this goddess was named Diana. Artemis was associated with hunting and the constellation of Orion (the hunter). She was also related to wild animals, children and choirs. She adored music and melodies and she was known for her ability to destroy her enemies and cause severe disease. Artemis' parents was King Zeus and Titanis Leto. She was a virgin goddess who enjoyed loneliness that's why she had no spouse and no children. Artemis was associated with all wild animals and especially the Deer, the Bear, the Wild Boar and the Quail. She also created many plants like the Cypress, the Walnut and many flowers like the Amaranth. This goddess used to carry bow and arrows.

8. God Apollon

Appolon was the god of the Sun. He was one of the few entities that had the same name in the Greek and Roman Pantheon. He was the god of harmony and music. He was associated with omens and prophecies that's why many oracles and especially the one in Delphi was dedicated to him. Apollon was also related to higher education and knowledge and he was known for his ability to heal all wounds of the soul and the body. Apart from healing he could also cause severe health issues. Apollon's parents were King Zeus and Titanis Leto. This superior god of the Greek Pantheon had no spouse but he created many powerful offsprings like Asklepios who was an entity related to medicines and healing. Animals associated with Appolon were the Swan, the Raven, the Mouse and the Wolf. Plants associated with Apollon were the Laurel and the Larkspur.

9. God Hephaistos

This major god (belongs to the 12 Olympian Gods) was called Vulcanus by the Romans. Hephaistos was the constructor of gods' weapons and he was also responsible for other inventions. He was related to all Metals and he knew how to handle each one. He was also related to fire, buildings and construction in general. He was the protector of all Earth's volcanoes. Hephaistos' mother was Queen Hera and he had no father. He was married to Aphrodite but some historians say that his spouse was Tharis (Grace). Hephaistos was a master in robotics. He could create "Automatons"; robot-like creatures with high intelligence. Animals associated with Hephaistos were the Crane and the Donkey. His favorite plant was the Fennel. This god appeared holding a powerful hammer in his hands.




10. God Poseidon

This major God was very important as it was related to the waters of planet Earth. The roman name for Poseidon is Neptune. Poseidon was king of the seas and rivers, waterfalls but he was also associated with earthquakes along with another Greek God named Engelados. Poseidon's father was the titan Kronos and the titanis Rhea. He was married to a beautiful Goddess named Amphitrite. They had several children. One of them was the powerful Triton. Poseidon created many animals on Earth like many fish species, the horse (he created it along with Hermes) and the dolphin. In the seas, Poseidon created his favorite plant the Seaweed. He was also associated with the Pine tree. Poseidon owned a powerful weapon, the Trident with which he could outsmart his enemies.

11. Goddess Aphrodite

This powerful goddess was mostly associated with love, beauty and sex. The Romans called her Venus. She is one of the most famous goddesses of the ancient Greek world. Aphrodite had the ability to offer pleasure and she was also related to procreation. The legend tells us that she was born out of the sea foam but it is very likely that her parents were King Zeus and Titanis Dione. Aphrodite was first married to Ares and later to Hephaistos. Eros (winged godling of love) was one of her most notable children but she also gave birth to many other offsprings. Aphrodite was related to many animals like the Turtle, the Dove, the Goose, the Hare and the Sparrow. Plants associated with this supreme goddess were the Apple tree, the Lettuce, the Rose, the Myrtle, the Myrrh tree and the Anemone.

12. Goddess Hestia

This powerful goddess was named Vesta or Vista by the Romans. She guarded homes, health, the principles of family. She was associated with meals and food in general, celebrations and feasts and of course offerings in sacrifices. Her parents were Titan Kronos and Titanis Rhea. Hestia was a virgin goddess and with no spouse she decided to produce no offsprings. Her animal was the Swine and she was related to the Chaste Tree. Hestia was famous about her wisdom and wise decisions in the ancient world were the 12 Olympian Gods ruled.
